Honey Crochet Patterns – Chevron Stitch Crochet Blanket (PDF Version)

Skill Level: Beginner to Intermediate

Finished Size: 34 in x 34 in

Gauge: 4 in = 13 stitches and 14 rows (in SC, back loop only)

Materials

- · Worsted weight yarn in multiple colors (for stripes) and white
- Crochet hook size H/5.0 mm
- Yarn needle
- Scissors
- Measuring tape

📝 Stitches & Abbreviations

- SC Single Crochet:
 Insert hook, yarn over (YO), pull up a loop, YO, pull through both loops.
- SC2TOG Single Crochet 2 Together:
 Insert hook, YO, pull up a loop, insert hook into the next stitch, YO, pull up a loop, YO, pull through all loops on the hook.

Note: Work all SC stitches in the back loop only for added texture.

Sizing & Pattern Multiple

- Chain a multiple of **29 + 3** to change the blanket size.
- Sample blanket uses a starting chain of 177 stitches.

Pattern Instructions

Foundation Chain:

Chain 177.

Row 1:

In the second chain from the hook and the next chain, SC2TOG. SC in the next 13 chains, 3 SC in the next chain (this is the peak), SC in the next 13 chains, skip 2 chains (this is the valley).

Repeat from * to * across. SC2TOG the last two stitches. Ch 1, turn.

Row 2 (and all remaining rows): (Work in back loops only)

SC2TOG the first 2 stitches, SC in the next 13 stitches, 3 SC into the peak (center stitch of previous 3-SC group), SC in the next 13 stitches, skip 2 stitches at the valley.

Repeat across. SC2TOG the last two stitches. Ch 1, turn.

Repeat Row 2 until your blanket reaches the desired length.

Color Pattern

- Change color every 14 rows.
- Insert **14 rows of white** between each color block to give clean, modern striping.

Pattern Tips

- Always begin and end with SC2TOG.
- Count your stitches often to keep the chevron shape consistent.
- Use stitch markers if needed to mark the peaks and valleys.
- Weave in ends as you go for cleaner finishing.
