Flower Granny Square Crochet Pattern

Granny squares are timeless pieces in the world of crochet, and this beautiful floral granny square is the perfect combination of classic charm and modern design. With a delicate flower in the center and layers of color framing it, this square is ideal for blankets, cushions, table runners, or even combined into garments.

Materials

- 3 colors of worsted weight yarn (example: pink, white, and blue)
- 4.0 mm (G) crochet hook
- Scissors
- Tapestry needle

Abbreviations (US Terms)

- ch = chain
- sl st = slip stitch
- sc = single crochet
- dc = double crochet
- tr = treble crochet
- -st = stitch
- sp = space

Pattern Instructions

Round 1:

With Color A (pink), ch 8 and join with a sl st to form a ring.

Ch 3 (counts as 1 dc), work 23 dc into the ring. Join with sl st in top of beginning ch-3. (24 dc)

Round 2 (flower petals):

Change to Color B (white). *Ch 7, skip 1 st, sl st in next st*. Repeat around to create 12 loops. Join with sl st. (12 ch-7 loops)

Round 3:

In each ch-7 loop, work: (1 sc, 1 hdc, 7 dc, 1 hdc, 1 sc). Repeat in all loops to form 12 petals. Join with sl st. Fasten off.

Round 4 (corners):

Join Color C (blue) in any sc between petals. *Ch 3 (counts as dc), 2 dc in same st, ch 3, 3 dc in next sc (corner made), ch 5*. Repeat around to form 4 corners separated by ch-5 spaces. Join with sl st.

Round 5 (sides):

SI st into next dc. *Ch 3 (counts as dc), 2 dc, ch 2, 3 dc in corner space. In next ch-5 space: work 5 dc. In next ch-5 space: work 5 dc. *Repeat around. Join with sI st.

Round 6 (pink border):

Change to Color A (pink). *Ch 3, skip 1 st, 1 dc in next st, ch 1, 1 dc in same st (V-stitch)*. Repeat pattern around sides, working (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in corners. Join with sl st.

Round 7 (final round):

Ch 1, sc in each stitch around, working 3 sc in each corner space. Join with sl st. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Finishing

Block your granny square gently with steam or water to open up the flower and even out the edges.

Conclusion

This flower granny square is perfect to brighten up any crochet project. Whether you join many of them together for a blanket or use just one as a decorative motif, the result will always be charming.

■ Tip: Try using variegated yarn for the petals to create a more realistic flower effect!
